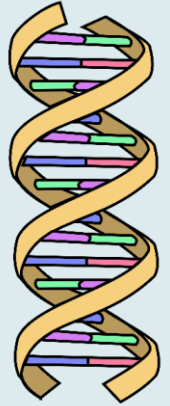


THE ROLE OF GENETICS IN EARLY INTERVENTION
